MINUTES OF THE 16TH MEETING OF THE PROGRAM STEERING COMMITTEE (PSC) OF SINDH MUNICIPAL SERVICES DELIVERY PROGRAM (MSDP) HELD ON 21ST FEBRUARY,2023

The 16th Program Steering Committee (PSC) meeting for the implementation of USAID supported Sindh - Municipal Services Program (MSDP) was held under the Chairmanship of Chairman, Planning & Development Board, on Tuesday, the 21st February 2023 at 11.00 a.m. in the Committee Room of Planning & Development Department, Government of Sindh. The list of participants is attached at **Annexure-A**. The USAID's representatives participated in the meeting which included Ms. Sarah Parvez, Assistant Director and Mr. Adeel Ahmed, Program Manager Specialist (Engineering) MSP.

- 2. At the outset, the Chairman welcomed the participants and especially thanked the representatives of USAID for regularly/consistently attending the meeting as observers and contributing useful suggestions.
- 3. Ms. Sarah Parvez, informed the forum that the PSC meeting has not been held regularly and the remaining work of the Waste Water (Sanitation) which is already in pipeline is required to be completed before the close of the Program i.e. September, 2023. Accordingly, the Chair informed the representative of the USAID that due to working on Rehabilitation of flood affected peoples throughout Sindh, the meeting was delayed.
- 4. After detailed deliberations, following decisions were taken:

5. The Contract of Project Consultant i.e., **M/S RCC Consultants** is also required to be extended / revised accordingly.

Decision:

The forum already decided in Item No.02 to complete all works physically (actually on grounds) by September, 2023 and their Defect Liability Periods (DLP) by September, 2024, so the time frame of above charts be re-adjusted accordingly. The Re-adjustment chart of time frame is attached (at Appendix-B).

ITEM NO. 04: AWARD OF CONTRACT PACKAGE WW-16 ENHANCEMENT OF SEWERAGE FLOW FROM MAIN PUMPING HOUSE OF ZONE-A, B & C TO THEIR OXIDATION POND FOR TREATMENT PURPOSE IN JACOBABAD. (CONTRACT COST PKR 394,706,716/-)

- 6. The forum was informed that in light of decision of the 15th PSC at Agenda Item No.02, the Procurement process of subject contract package has been initiated and completed within the given timelines as follows:
- i. NIT was published on 17-08-2022 through three newspapers. (Dawn, Jang & Kawish).
- ii. Bids were opened on 13-09-2022. (Two bidders had participated).
- iii. Technical bids evaluation was completed on 20-09-2022. (Two bidders had technically qualified).
- iv. Financial Bid opened on 26-09-2022.
- v. The recommendation of Procurement Committee was finalized in its meeting held on 11-10-2022 with consultation of RCC Consultants/"The Engineer", as well as USAID representative. (M/s Muhammad Iqbal Shaikh qualified with lowest quoted amount of Rs. 394,706,716/-.
- vi. After completing all codal formalities, the recommended documents were hoisted on SPPRA Web site on 28-10-2022.
- vii. The Work awarded on February 09, 2023 with time limit of 05 months from the date of commencement.
- viii. The funds against this contract will be charged from USAID available share.

Decision:

The forum perused these steps taken by the MSDP.

- ITEM NO. 05: (A&B) AWARD OF CONTRACT PACKAGE WW-19, 20 & 21 FOR ULTIMATE DISPOSAL OF TREATED WASTE WATER FROM OXIDATION PONDS OF ZONE A, B & D BY CONSTRUCTION OF PUMPING HOUSE AND CONNECTIVITY THROUGH P/L RISING MAIN (THE OVERALL TENTATIVE ESTIMATED COST PKR 473,413,472). ON THE BASIS OF PRESENT FINANCIAL POSITION, THE CONTRACT PACKAGE OF WW-19 WILL BE FUNDED THROUGH AVAILABLE USAID SHARE AND WW-20 & 21 SHALL BE FROM GOS SHARE.
- The forum was informed that in the light of the decision of 15th PSC at Agenda # 3, it was suggested to take-up 2 oxidation ponds out of 3. However, after reconsideration of the site situation, USAID apprehension in their letter dated October 21, 2022 availability of the fund and to consider the development potential of Municipal Committee Jacobabad, MSDP now proposed to operationalize all 3 remaining oxidation ponds by construction of pumping house and connectivity with ultimate disposal point through rising main.
- 8. In light of the above facts, Project Consultant; RCC Consultant-The Engineer has prepared the engineering estimates for all 3 remaining oxidation ponds namely Zone-A (Aqil Pur), Zone-B (Ahmed Pur) and Zone-D (Jani Dero). Tender Documents are almost ready for bidding process.

- 12. The expected cost to rehabilitate existing 3 Oxidation Ponds namely Aqil Pur, Ahmed Pur & Jani Dero is in between PKR 50 to 70 m PKR.

13. The Overall fund arrangement of Contract Package WW-19, 20 & 21 as well as rehabilitation of existing 3 Oxidation Ponds namely Aqil Pur, Ahmed Pur & Jani Dero will be covered from USAID Share (Grant in Aid) & GOS (Share) provided as PKR 600 m. The tabulated financial proposal is at (Appendix-B).

B-EXTENSION OF USAID FINANCIAL PLAN UPTO SEPTEMBER 2024.

- 14. The forum was informed that USAID/Pakistan and Government of Sindh entered into an Activity Agreement for the execution of Sindh Municipal Services Delivery Program (MSDP), with USAID contributing USD 66.0 Million as a Grant along with Government of Sindh's counterpart share amounting to Rs.926.55 million, agreed upon six towns of the province through Program Management Unit (PMU-MSDP) with its completion period upto 30th September, 2023.
- 15. In the 1st phase, Water Supply Scheme, Solid Waste Management System has been completed and handed over to the Municipal Committee, Jacobabad. And, the Local Government Support Activity LGSA & Energy Audit Study of Dhabeji Pumping Complex EAS of DPC has also been completed. The work of Waste Water (Sanitation) is currently in progress. To complete all the remaining works of Contract Packages of Sewerage System, the expected timeline(s) are as follows:-

16. It was further informed that the completion of all the Waste Water (Sanitation) Contract Packages including WW-16,19, 20 and 21 tentatively to be completed in between April to December, 2023. Afterwards, there will be a Defect Liability Period (DLP) of one year as per conditions of contract. The closure of contract, completion of the PC-IV of the Program and demobilization after completing all codal formalities will also take some reasonable time. All these activities are expected to be completed by June 2025; therefore, it is requested that functions of MSDP including PMU and PSU may be extended till June 2025 and sufficient fund may be allocated in each Fiscal Year out of approved budget of the Program/Project whereas; USAID already requested to extend their financial disbursement upto September 2024 with presence of their 3rd Party Monitoring Team till July 2024.

In this connection, it is pointed out that the MSDP Contract & Contingent/Service Rendered Employees may be converted into **Permanent Body of Urban Unit of P&D**, **GoS** for which it is requested that: a) Call an In-House Meeting in P&D Department to find a way forward **AND / OR** b) Constitute a working Committee of P&D Department for shifting the services of these MSDP employees to Urban Policy Unit, which will continue to work for remaining components of MSDP as well as other assigned by their Administrative Department.

Decision:

a)The forum after detailed deliberation has decided that all the physical (actually on ground) activities of the Program including Sewerage Works be completed by September, 2024 along with their DLPs. The USAID also confirm that the request of Extension in disbursement of USAID funds is under process of approval upto September,2024, So accordingly a separate Note to the Chair with Financial Implication Plan of USAID Funds as well as GOS Share funds be prepared and submit it for Extension of the Program Period.

b) The Chair advised MSDP that the action of Conversion of Employees of MSDP in to Urban Unit of P&DD and concerned Municipal Committee is the matter of Administrative Department and not for the PSC, therefore; decided that a separate Note for AD i.e. P&DD be furnish in this

matter.

- 19. The forum was informed that there are two sources of funding of MSDP Sindh, i.e., one from the Government of Sindh, mostly for the administrative functions of the Program and the other from the USAID, mostly for the capital/infrastructure works.
- 20. USAID has signed several Program Implementation Letters (PILs) for Water Supply schemes, Solid Waste Management System at Jacobabad, Local Government Strengthening Activity and Waste Water schemes. The summary of the releases as well as expenditures/expenses incurred since the financial year 2012-13 for both the sources (USAID & GoS) are as under:

21. It is submitted that against the 1st & 2nd DROs, an amount of **Rs. 96.800 million** (Rs.47.500 + 49.300 million) out of Rs.200M (Revenue) and **Rs. 30.398** M out of 122.820 (Capital) were released.

The Release and Expenditure sheet was perused by the forum, the Chair also directed that this sheet may be placed after the compliance Status of the last PSC meeting. The USAID also earmarked to the chair that around 6.6 million USD are remaining to be spent in the allowable disbursement dead line of USAID.

The forum that against the 1st DRO being 25% amounting to Rs.50.000 million for 03 months (July to September, 2022), a sum of **Rs. 47.500 million** (Rs.30.00 + Rs.12.500 + Rs.5.00 million = 47.500 million) was released with a limited provision in Salary, Regular Allowances, Rent Charges, while no funds were provided in Machinery & Equipment, Stationery, Printing Charges, Communication, TA/DA & Maintenance Charges which was also necessarily required to run the Program.

- 23. It is further submitted that against the 2nd Draft Release Order (DRO) being 25% amounting to Rs.50.00 million (Rupees Fifty Million only) a sum of Rs.49.300 million was released.
- 24. It is further pointed out that out of released Rs. 96.800 million a sum of Rs.63.016 million have been incurred i.e., 65% of the total release, leaving the balance in Honoraria, Rent Charges which is not utilizable during first three quarters. There will be shortage of funds in the head of accounts Pay of Officer, Contractual/Contingent Staff, travelling allowance & Pension Civil etc to pay the salary for the month of March, 2023 and onward.
- 25. It is also pointed out that out of already approved amount of Rs.600.00 million, a sum of PKR.122.820 million has been allocated as Capital Component in the current fiscal year 2022-23, which will be insufficient to coup up with the required works in CFY. Hence, an additional amount of PKR.100.0 million will also require to be allocated and released during CFY, i.e., a total of Rs.222.820 million is required to be released in one go during current fiscal year 2022-23.
